We continue to see an increase in referrals and supports in Early Intervention. That means more babies and toddlers are receiving the therapies they need to learn and grow.

also part of Ohio's DSP Retention Payment Initiative, a first-of-its-kind investment into the incredible providers who help people live, learn and work.

We continue to add to the quality of life for adults with disabilities in Noble County through opportunities for job-related skill development, employment, housing, and transportation.

There is so much more to a fulfilling life than just having our needs met. That's why we connect people with disabilities to the community and the things they want, like places to live and learn, work and worship, volunteer and play.

- **We are there** 24/7/365 for people with disabilities.



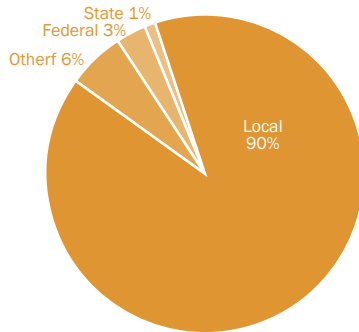

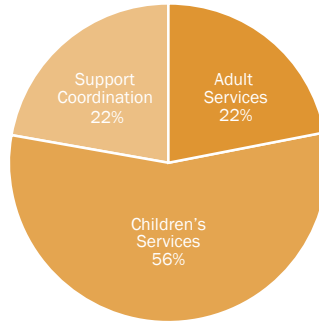
